 97 Transportation to form a multi-state planning and development task force specifically for
 98 the build-out of this corridor.

99 <u>SECTION SEVEN:</u> The City of Topeka urges Amtrak to restore to the Topeka
 100 station a full-time customer services representatives to serve the traveling public.

101 <u>SECTION EIGHT</u>: This Resolution will be in full force and effect from its date of
 102 passage by the Governing Body of The CITY OF TOPEKA, Kansas.
