

**RESOLUTION NO. 9369**

A RESOLUTION introduced by the Policy & Finance Committee recommending approval of the expenditure of American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") proceeds for social services.

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2022, the Governing Body approved allocating \$35.6 million of ARPA funds for capital improvement infrastructure projects, including water, sewer and broadband; and

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2022, the Governing Body approved allocating \$10 million of ARPA funds for social service programs; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body referred the social service program allocation process to the Policy & Finance Committee ("Committee"); and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2022, the Committee, after considering all of the applications for funding, recommended awards to be approved by the Governing Body.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the City of Topeka, Kansas, that it approves the allocation of ARPA funding to the entities identified in Exhibit A in the amounts specified.
